All-MIAA Golf Team Announced

Conference champion Mules place five on elite squad

(OVERLAND PARK, Kan.) — The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association champion Central Missouri State Mules (45 points in the MIAA standings) had five players earn honors on the 2001-02 All-MIAA Golf Team.

The All-MIAA Team is selected based on a point system determined by the players' finish at the five conference-sanctioned events played this season – two in the fall and three in the spring.

The lowest scorer in each meet is awarded 10 points, while the 10th lowest is given one point. This is the sixth year that this system has been used to determine the honorees.

The Mules, who are among the MIAA squads selected to play at the NCAA Division II Central/Great Lakes Super Regional at Union, Ky., May 6-8, won the MIAA Championship after placing second in the regular season-ending MIAA Tournament on Tuesday (April 30).

All five of Central's representatives are repeat honorees from last season, with two making the All-MIAA

list for the third straight season.

Seniors Terrence Lujin and Jeff Mason are the two third-year All-MIAA golfers, and they are joined by senior Brett Moomey, and juniors Jason Traeder and Joe Pryor.

Traeder was the top MIAA performer in three of the five conference-sanctioned events this season – the Truman Invitational and the Missouri-Rolla Miner Invitational in the fall and the CMSU Heart of America Invitational this spring.

Southwest Baptist (38 points) had two players make the squad – senior Justin Cox and freshman Nick Layman. The Bearcats won the MIAA Tournament on Tuesday to move up to second in the MIAA standings.

Missouri Southern (36 points) had three underclassmen make the list – junior Mickey Carpentersophomore Kyle Long and freshman Danny Sinksen.

Like the Mules, the Bearcats and Lions will compete in the Super Regional next week.

CMSU's Tim Poe was selected as the MIAA Coach of the Year.
